COUNCIL DIRECTOR MEETS ON VILLAGE SIGNAGE

The Ballarat City Council's Director of Growth and Development **Eric Braslis** came to Buninyong earlier this month to discuss township signage with a Buninyong Progress Association working group.

The BPA group had compiled a detailed study and report of existing township signage and had made numerous recommendations concerning a major upgrade to way-finding, place name and other signage in Buninyong.

Group convenor **Barry Fitzgerald** said that by any standard, local signage was "an uncoordinated mess".

Mr Braslis said that he was undertaking a comprehensive examination of signage across the city and that the Buninyong report would "prove to be invaluable". He said that in coming into Buninyong he had noted the poor condition of the entrance signage.

At the August meeting of the Progress
Association it was agreed that the President Ian
Salathiel would consult with a local leading
industrial designer who had indicated willingness
to assist with community projects, to discuss
development of some concept plans for entrance
signage

Consultant appointed

TRAFFIC IMPACT STUDY GETS UNDER WAY

After two years of lobbying by the Buninyong Progress Association, VicRoads has announced that a consultant has now been appointed to undertake a Traffic Impact Study for Buninyong.

The project, jointly funded by VicRoads and by the Ballarat City Council, is required to be completed within three months.

The study came about because of the BPA's concerns about the impact on the Buninyong community of increased traffic volumes from the new Ballarat Growth Zone and the Ballarat West Employment Zone which will be funnelled onto the Midland Highway at Magpie from the new Western Link Road.

The consultant will be required to report on the following

- (i) the additional traffic volumes, including heavy vehicles, on the Midland Highway through Buninyong, that might be attributed to the Ballarat West Growth/Industrial Zone for each stage of their development
- (ii) determine the increased traffic, including heavy vehicles, attributable to growth in travel between Geelong and Ballarat for the year 2020

- (iii) estimate traffic growth on the Ballarat-Buninyong Road for the year 2020 taking account of the likely residential, commercial and institutional development
- (iv) examine access arrangements to/from the existing service roads on the Midland Highway east of the Ballarat-Buninyong Road and recommend any improvements
- (v) assess pedestrian demands/desire lines in the Buninyong township and make recommendations for the provision of new or the upgrading of existing pedestrian crossing facilities
- (vi) make any other suggestions that might contribute to improving road safety and amenity in the township.

Although the matter of a possible by-pass road for Buninyong is not included in the above study, VicRoads has noted the Progress Association's request that some planning to determine possible east-west by-pass routes of the town be initiated.

BPA President **Ian Salathiel** said that the Association was "extremely pleased" at the action taken by VicRoads and the Council to look at the traffic problems in Buninyong. "Traffic is fast becoming a problem here, and seems certain to get worse in future years "he said.

TOWER GROUP PULLS OUT OF VCAT APPEAL

Crown Castle, the company which proposed the erection of a 40m telecommunications tower in Macs Road, Buninyong, has withdrawn its appeal to VCAT against Ballarat City Council's decision to refuse a planning permit.

Following a strong community campaign objecting to the tower, Council had unanimously rejected the Planning Application at its February 2012 meeting, and Crown Castle immediately lodged an appeal with VCAT.

The Council and five local residents indicated to VCAT that they wished to appear to contest the Crown Castle application.

Advice recently received from the Melbourne law firm representing Crown Castle indicated that their client had applied for leave to withdraw from the VCAT proceedings, and that they had been instructed that "our client no longer requires a telecommunications facility in this location at this time."

The genus *Rhipsalis*



This tropical epiphytic genus is named from a Greek word meaning 'wicker-work' referring to the slender pliable branches of the typical species. Whilst most are found in America a few are found in Africa, Madagascar and Sri Lanka. The theory is that they may have been introduced from seed eaten by migrating birds. The photograph left shows like *Hoyas* and *xEpicactus* they grow thru hanging basket chains, squeeze thru narrow openings and in this case Shade Cloth

Whilst I grow a few in hanging containers outside most are in shade houses protected from the winter rains. I have been delighted with their ease of growth and captivated with the small yellow or white flowers. Perhaps my favorite is




growth once established. It is s a native to Brazil and surrounding areas. The flowers are white in colour and produced from the ends of short shoots. One book tells me it grows to 15 centimeters long but mine would hang to at least three times this length.



As many as four species are found in Madagascar. Contrary to the general belief all cacti originate from either North or South America. Rhipsalis is the only cactus genus to be distributed in South and East Africa, Madagascar and Sri

An interesting genus not as spectacular as xEpicactus but shows much more diversity in their shape and the flowers although small are rewarding. Noel Main Ballarat Cactus Society




