

BUNINYONG MASONIC LODGE

Freemasonry Celebrates 155 years in Buninyong

Freemasons have been meeting in the Buninyong community since April 22nd 1858. During the first 50 years they met at the Nugget Hotel, Buninyong Hotel, Crown Hotel, Shire Hall at Mt Clear and Buninyong Town Hall.

The original Lodge building was erected at 604 Warrenheip Street site in 1906 and incorporated into the current building in 1929. Further extensions have been carried out to the Kitchen and entrance areas in later years.

In April 1998 Buninyong Lodge No 23 and Sturt No 427 consolidated to form the Sturt-Buninyong United Lodge No 23. Charity is one of the tenets of Freemasonry and the Lodge dispenses charity to the wider local community to a value of around \$4000. This money is raised by the sale of fruit in late December early January each year. The June/July project of 2012 provided blankets to Uniting Care Ballarat and \$1600 to their breezeway meals program.

The Lodge is fortunate to have all the minute books from 1858, some of the early ledgers and most of the appearance books.

The cost to join the lodge in 1858 was 5 guineas and a further 5 shillings per month. By 1926 the fee was 10 guineas. At its peak the lodge membership was 265, the largest lodge outside the Metropolitan area and had 60 father and son members. In 1937 88 members and 112 visitors attended the installation meeting. In 1946 the installation attendance was 289.

In early times Lodge meetings followed the full moon. This provided light for members to safely travel to and from the lodge. Members and visitors came by various means of transport over the 155 years. They walked, came by buggy, a Davis Bus even by train. As the motor car became more available it became the principle mode of transport.

The principles of Freemasonry have not changed over the 155 years. These principles include:

Liberty=Freedom of speech-Impartiality-Pursuing Individual Excellence

Fraternity= Brotherly friendship, support and respect- Mutual self improvement – Honesty and Integrity

Equality= Uniform thoughts, words and deeds- Charitable goodwill, tolerance, relief and kindness to others.

Experience – a Valuable but Incomplete Teacher

My preference when flying is a window seat with non-packaged scenery, despite the entertainment available on the screen ahead of me.

Having booked such a seat for flying from Dubai to New York I was greatly anticipating views of the Persian Gulf, Black Sea, southern Russia and the whole panorama of Europe.

Unfortunately, reality ignored my anticipation, for clouds blanketed everything below.

Eventually, clear skies over the Baltic Sea revealed another gap—between assumption and actuality.

I first thought that Sweden's white-lined coast below was just like the white, sandy beaches that mostly surround Australia. Until I realised that the whiteness was not sand; but more snow than I had ever seen before. It suddenly felt quite pleasant to be warmly cocooned above it.

We later passed over Iceland, named for reasons that require no imagination. My neighbour leaned over, looked down and asked no-one in particular, "How can people breathe down there?"

He explained that he had only ever seen snow in India's Himalayas, where oxygen-depleted, high-altitude air makes breathing very difficult.

Both our responses to these sights were shaped by experience, which was natural but incomplete.

Effective teachers start with what students have experienced or can identify, so they may embrace all the discoveries that new ideas open up for them. Like Jesus, who used everyday pictures: sowing crops, losing sheep, family bust-ups or dishonest business practices; to describe the mind-blowing idea that God's love can renew everyday people, regardless of our understanding, our appearance, or our experience.
