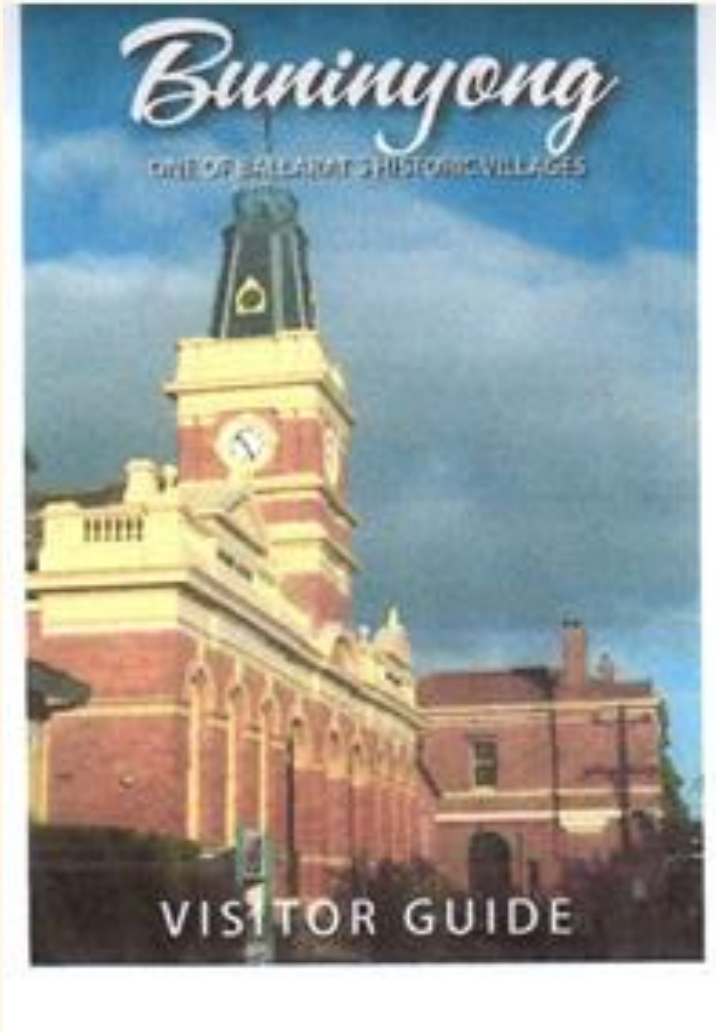

## **NEW VISITOR GUIDE OUT NEXT WEEK**

A revised edition of the free and full colour *Buninyong Visitor Guide* will be available within the next few days. The first edition of 5000 copies was produced in May 2013

The brochure has been funded by Ballarat Regional Tourism, and is a project of the Buninyong and District Community Association. It now consists of 28 pages.



Project co-ordinator Barry Fitzgerald said that the new publication showcased the features of Buninyong and district and would have a major role to play in bringing more tourists and visitors to the area.

“Accommodation providers find the brochure especially useful to send out to those looking to visit or stay in Buninyong, and especially when guests do arrive in the area” he said.

The *Buninyong Visitor Guide* will be available from local retail outlets, particularly those such as coffee shops and restaurants which cater for visitors

The guide will also be available at both the Buninyong Visitor Centre at the Old Library, at the Ballarat Tourist Information Centre and at Ballarat hotels and motels

The new edition has been expanded because of the growing number of retail businesses now operating along the Buninyong shopping strips. It also includes links to other sources of local information, details of how to get to Buninyong

by the #10 bus, and reference to new facilities such as the Youth Space in Forest Street

Improved versions of the special walking, cycling and local drive maps developed for the first edition are again included in the guide.

## **FREEMASONS SUPPORT CANCER CAMP**

The No. 23 Masonic Social Committee recently donated \$600 to the Ballarat “Cops ‘n Kids” program. The donation was jointly supported financially by the Board of Benevolence of Freemasons Victoria. The “Cops ‘n Kids” program is run by Ballarat Police in conjunction with many organisations, including the Royal Children's Hospital and Challenge, a support network for children with cancer and their families. The program is run at no cost to the attendees due to the generosity of the Ballarat community and businesses. The children attending the Ballarat camp are selected from those undergoing treatment at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne, and are aged between 4 and 8 years of age. Victoria Police provide coach transport from Challenge headquarters in Melbourne for the children and carers. The idea of the camp is to allow some respite for the families with seriously ill children from the everyday anxieties and caring responsibilities of their child.

The No. 23 Masonic Social Committee has for many years operated an annual fruit sale for charity from the premises of Hewitt & Whitty in Ballarat. The fruit is picked up from Shepparton using a truck so generously donated each year by the Hewitt & Whitty, and the funds generated are donated to worthy local charities.

Over the last 15 years, over \$40,000 has been presented to local charities and organisations in the local Ballarat district. The No. 23 Masonic Social Committee is a sub-committee of the Sturt-Buninyong United lodge which meets monthly at the Masonic Centre in Buninyong.

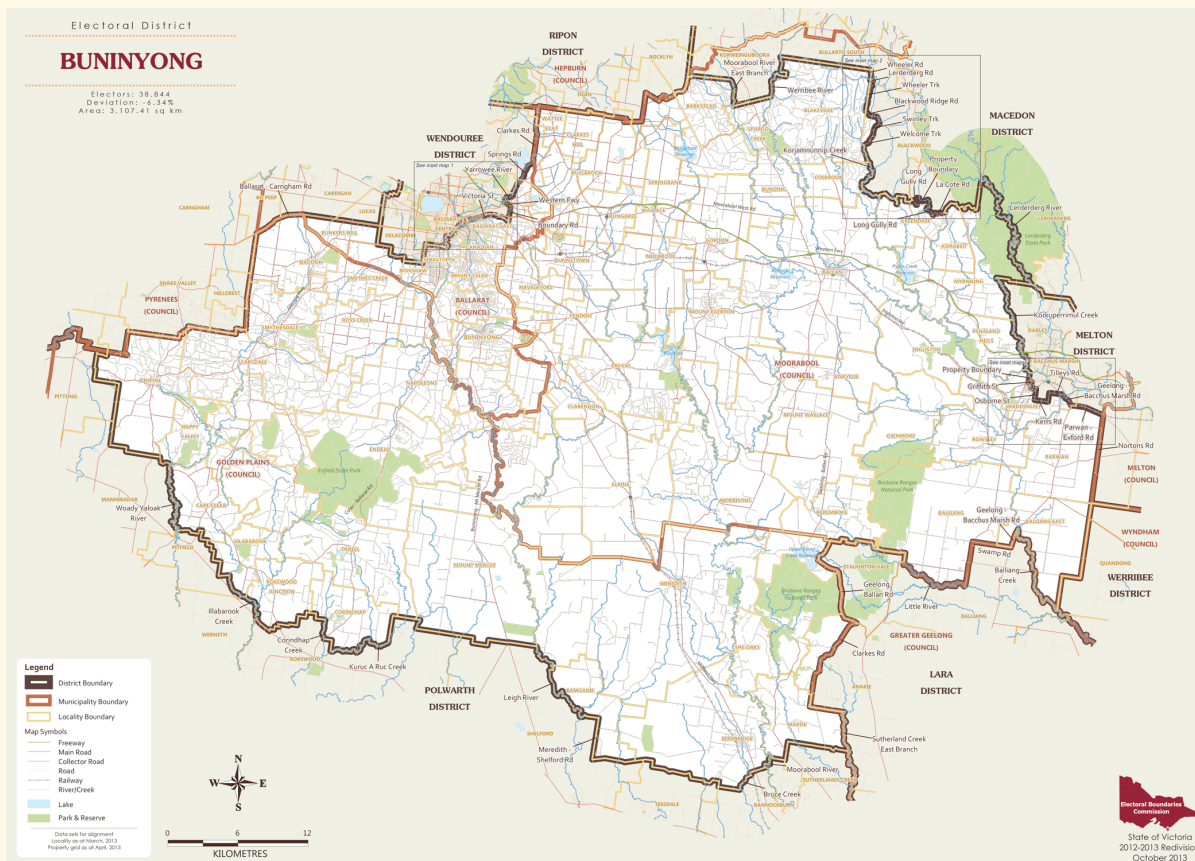
## State Election

# ***FOUR CANDIDATES FACE OFF AT BUNINYONG***

Four of the candidates for the State seat of Buninyong will appear on the same platform at a community forum to be held at the Buninyong Town Hall on Thursday 9 October commencing at 7.30pm.

The “new” electorate of Buninyong replaces the former Ballarat East electorate, held by a margin of 1.6 per cent by the ALP’s Geoff Howard. The electorate now covers some 3100 km<sup>2</sup>.

In addition to urban areas of Ballarat such as Sebastopol, Eureka, Golden Point, Canadian, Mt Clear and Buninyong, the re-drawn electorate also includes widely-spread rural areas such as Snake Valley, Smythesdale, Linton, Rokewood, Elaine, Lethbridge, Ballan and Bungaree.



Residents from any of the above areas will be most welcome to attend the Forum.

Candidates who have agreed to participate are

- Tony Goodfellow (Greens),

- Geoff Howard (ALP),
- Sonia Smith (Nationals) , and
- Ben Taylor (Liberals)

The Forum is being organised by the Buninyong & District Community Association (BDCA) and will follow the format of the one held in Buninyong before the 2010 State election.

Each candidate will be allocated ten minutes to speak and will then have to field a maximum of five questions from the members of audience. Other candidates will also be able to address one question each to the speaker. The order of speakers will be drawn by lot

Issues expected to be addressed by the candidates include traffic, roads and road safety, planning issues including new State government rezoning proposals, business development and tourism in the area, environmental issues relating to the Canadian forest and to green wedge areas along the Geelong Road between Mount Clear and Buninyong, and funding for projects in various centres in the electorate.

## ***Buninyong Retailers Get Together...again***

Buninyong shopfront retailers are set to become active again as a group in the local area with the formation of the Buninyong Retail Group (BRG) at a meeting held at the Buninyong Town Hall on 30 September.

The Buninyong & District Community Association (BDCA) developed a data base of the growing number of retailers in Buninyong and convened the meeting at which it was decided to re-establish the group. The BDCA has agreed to "auspice" the fledgling group and provide assistance as required.

The inaugural meeting, attended by sixteen business owners/operators, was coordinated by the BDCA's **Barry Fitzgerald** who acted as interim Chair for the initial meeting. Apologies were received from four other business owners.

Also present was **Cr Peter Innes** who congratulated those present on the initiative and who agreed to act as a Council liaison person for the group on an ongoing basis

Former convenor of the defunct Buninyong Traders Association **Ron Delaland** told the meeting of the efforts to get a similar group operating in the past. He said that there was a new enthusiasm in the group with new businesses starting up in the village.

The meeting established an interim Committee of five persons who are now responsible for finalising the formal documentation necessary to set up the group.

The interim Committee consists of **Gael Fennell** (Sew Special: Button Heaven), **Ron Delaland** (Buninyong Newsagency), **Paul O'Beirne** (Foundation Legal), **Tracey Spencer** (Lana Rose), and **Martin Huntley** (Harcourts).

This group will now liaise with retailers in the village, arrange meetings, identify joint projects (such as Christmas shop decorations), and review and finalise the BRG's objectives and directions.

The next meeting of the group is scheduled for Tuesday 11 November 2014 (possibly at Unique Garden Décor) with the venue to be finalised and advised to all on the group's data base.

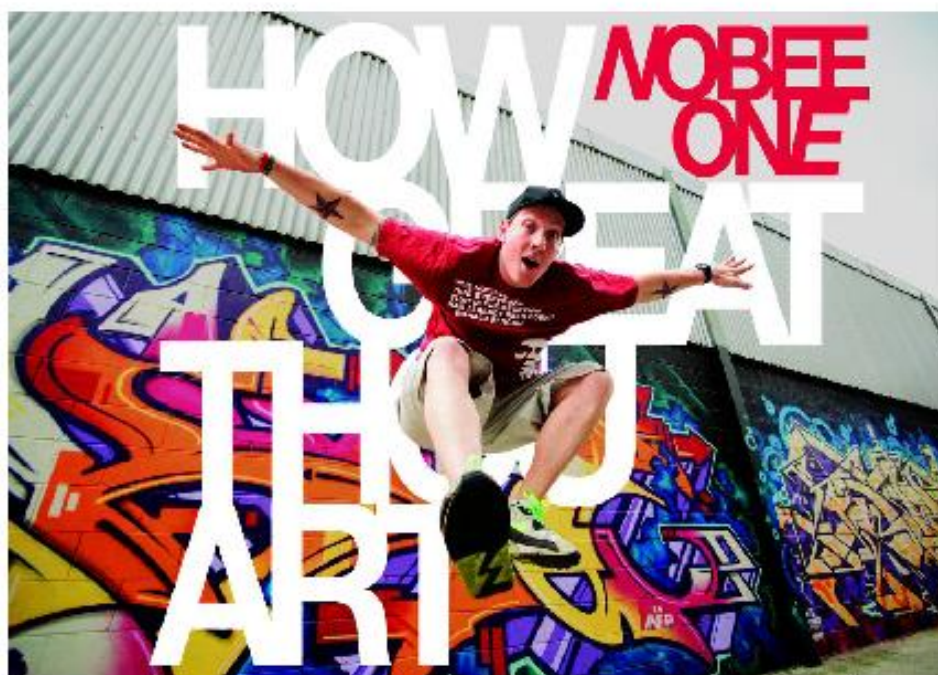

The Grand Gala Opening of the ***Museum of Truth & Lies*** is to be launched at the Maryborough Railway Station on Saturday 11 October from 7pm, and everyone is welcome.

It will be an evening of free fun for all ages, featuring a parade, roving performers and local musicians, installations and artworks and later, spectacular ***Light Night Out*** events.

The ***Museum of Truth & Lies*** is a collection of tall tales and true. As in every museum, each object and picture has a story. But is it a fact or a fiction? Fabricated by students, community groups and individual of the Central Goldfields Shire, the Museum will delight and intrigue. Visit the Museum and ask "Where does truth lie?"

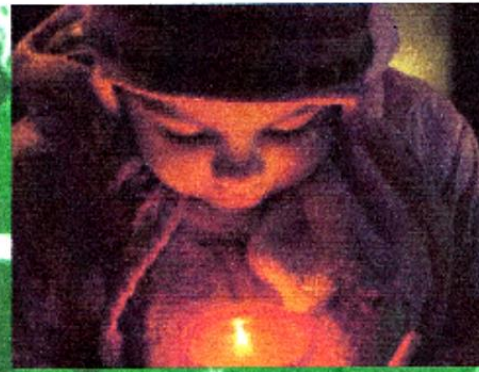
Rose Turtle Ertler, probably best known for her inspirational ukulele playing and teaching is now recording "tall stories" from local people.

In the film we follow acclaimed National Geographic photographer James Balog across the Arctic as he deploys sophisticated time-lapse cameras to capture the multi-year changes in the Northern glaciers. For his project, *Extreme Ice Survey*, Balog and his young team come to understand the character and nature of ice as they witness the massive changes that are occurring. This film has won numerous awards including the winner of the Satellite Award for Best Documentary.
